#### Weekly Parent Information Envelopes: Please stay informed!

As an aid in providing complete and organized communication, we send home a parent envelope each week. It is the vehicle for all written communication coming from school: parent newsletters, monthly calendars, lunch menus, sports and extracurricular sign-ups, classroom curriculum updates, etc. We ask that you remove and read the contents each week, sign the envelope and send it back to school the next school day. There is just one envelope per family. (The oldest sibling will be given the envelope if there is more than one child enrolled.)

#### SMA Web Site: www.stmartinacademy.org & E-Mail Policy:

Check out our web site! It provides the weekly newsletter and monthly classroom newsletters and calendars. The hot lunch menu and sports schedules are also available. Every teacher has their own e-mail on the school's web site. Although we understand it is important for communication to be fast and efficient, as a faculty and staff we do not want to compromise the Workshop Way® philosophy which encourages each child to grow in her/his own way and time regarding responsibility and self management. In the upper grades, especially, students are responsible for knowing their own homework and long-range assignments. As parents and teachers, we do not want to enable our children by managing their lives.

The purpose of e-mail is not to replace personal contact with teacher/parent/student or replace conferences by phone. If parents are concerned with their child's progress, an appointment with the teacher can be made via e-mail. Parents can continue to obtain general information through the office or on the web site which is updated weekly. E-mails directly to teachers should be related to issues or concerns that only the teacher can address. Teachers will check their e-mail every day and will respond within 48 hours if possible.

#### Sick /Tardy Students:

Parents are required to call or e-mail (info@stmartinacademy.org) the school office by 8:00 a.m. if a child is sick or tardy. Reminder: lunch is ordered at 8:10a.m. If your child is tardy and needs a lunch please call before 8:10!

# Student Pick-Up Information:

We are not able to release a child to any person who is not listed on the contact/emergency release form. A note must be sent to the school office in the morning if you are authorizing another person to pick up your child. (Phone calls will be accepted only in emergency situations.) Students who are not picked up by 2:45 p.m. are directed to check in at day care. Students arriving at school before 7:45 a.m. must also check in at day care. (There is not a charge for 5-10 minutes.)

Morning drop-off for Academy students should be ONLY IN FRONT OF SCHOOL (<u>do not park in upper parking lot</u> <u>or drop off in front of church</u>) We are very concerned with the safety of our preschoolers and their families, especially during drop off time from 7:45-8:00 am. Please adhere to this school policy.

#### At Dismissal Time: (2:30 - 2:45)

We ask for your cooperation at this time. All teachers and instructional assistants need to be present in front of school to supervise their respective students. We request that you do not go to the classrooms or approach teachers during this period of time. Their focus needs to be on the students during this particular 15 minute period. You are, however, welcome to come at 2:45 when the teachers return to the school building. (FYI: There are staff meetings each Tuesday at 3:00 p.m.)

# **Regarding Birthday Invitations:**

Invitations may not be distributed in the classroom or on the school campus unless every student in a class (or all the boys, all the girls) are invited to a birthday party. Otherwise it is the parents' responsibility to send out the invitations from home. If all the children in a class are not invited to a party, please encourage your child not to be talking about his/her party, who is invited, etc. at school. (We don't want children to feel excluded or hurt ... and it has happened more than we would like to see.) Also, do not bring to school any cupcakes, candy, etc. Your child may come in free dress the day of their birthday and it will be celebrated in a special way in the classroom.

# Parents/Visitors on Campus: (policy)

The school grounds are private property. For security purposes, anyone coming on campus must first report to the school office to sign in. Permission from the principal is required of all visitors to the classrooms or other facilities during school hours. Visitors will receive a "visitors" badge. When the visitors leave, they must sign-out and turn in their badge. This policy applies to all except employees of the school, parish staff and students currently enrolled here.

# Hot Lunch:

Ticket books are for sale in the school office for \$30.00 (10 lunches) or 20 for \$60.00. Please make checks payable to St. Martin Academy. Students need to have a ticket in order to have a hot lunch. Lunch coupons cannot be sold separately. Please note: some families may qualify for free or reduced lunches. Applications are in the school office. Lunches are ordered by 8:10 each day. If your child is late and needs a lunch, please call the school office by 8:10 so a lunch may be ordered. The cost of milk and juice is  $35\phi$  if purchased separately.

#### Involvement in School Masses (choir members: grades 4-7)

Choir: We will again be forming a choir for the 2008-2009 school year. Choir members will have the responsibility of leading the congregation in singing at our school Masses throughout the year. Criteria/Expectations: prayerful reverence during Mass, ability to sing on pitch, willingness to take direction. More information will be presented in each classroom next week and sign-up forms will be distributed.

# **RCIA – Rite of Christian Initiation**

The Rite of Christian Initiation is the way the Catholic Church accepts new adult members, as well as children of catechetical age, 8 years or older, who have not been baptized. The RCIA process has started in the rectory conference room at 7PM on Tuesday evenings.
