Providing for Students a Lifetime Advantage: A System of Education that sets SMA apart

State Curriculum Standards are addressed and delivered in such a way that the human growth of each child is nourished in the learning process. The school's philosophy and goals are fully integrated in the instructional techniques and strategies and in all teacher-student interactions. There is a clear purpose and structure to all classroom activities. Nothing is left to chance. Challenge, motivation for lifetime learning, and differentiated instructional methods are built into the system so as to meet the needs of both high and low academic achieving students.

Helping Families Afford a Catholic School Education

Catholic elementary schools continue to operate significantly below the cost per child of public or private schools. This is due, in part, to the fact that the teacher salaries are not comparable with those in the public sector. Nevertheless, the operating costs rise each year and so tuition must increase. Each year the need to help families with the cost of tuition also increases.

Especially given the current economic conditions, the cost of a Catholic School education is a problem for many families who would otherwise want to enroll their children at St. Martin of Tours Academy. If there is a proven financial need, we provide families with a subsidy to partially cover the total tuition amount which is based on the cost per child at \$4,908.

The amount needed for tuition assistance for the next 2011-2012 school year is \$74,000. Raising the money for tuition subsidy grants is an ongoing endeavor. Memorial, Commemorative, Tribute Bricks

Personalized bricks are an opportunity to secure a lasting place in SMA history. Within the last seven years four decorative walls of inscribed bricks have been constructed at the Peace Garden which is located behind the rectory and overlooking the sports field. There currently are bricks for some SMA classes, alums, staff, longtime bingo workers, volunteers, former pastors, families connected with the school and/or parish, parents of alums who have died. Bricks are still being placed on the most recent wall and so are available as follows: 4"x8" - (3 line inscription) - donation: \$100.00, 8"x8" (6 line inscription)- donation: \$175.00. (20 characters per line, including spaces and punctuation.) The donations pay for the inscription and help to offset the costs of constructing the walls.
